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Welcome to our second annual Summer Camp Resource Guide!

Hi there!

We're so glad you've found this exciting resource. This year, the BI team is excited to bring back our wildly popular Summer Camp Guide with all new projects to help save you time, money, and stress. We hope you find our guide to be fun, inspiring & easy to use. Most of all, we hope it helps motivate you to plan your best summer ever!

Before we dive in, we'd like to share just a few notes about the program to help you get started.

- 1. Included in these pages are four complete weeks of camp. We've defined a "week" of camp to be 5 days that are 3 hours each. Every program is a little different, and we've tried to maintain a level of flexibility that allows you to adjust the sessions to fit your studio.
- 2. For each week, you'll find a suggested schedule, quick tips and time filling activities, project guides, and a material list for simple ordering.
- 3. Each week is structured around 1-2 multi-day projects with a few smaller projects mixed in. For any project that requires more than one day of work, you'll find a "Suggested Session" section in the project guide. We've broken each large project into manageable pieces to allow time for decorating, drying, firing, etc. As with every other part of our guide, we hope you'll feel free to adjust these sessions to support your needs.
- 4. In addition, we've structured each week to give you the ability to fire and return any projects by the end of the week. Because of this, we've grouped fired or multi-stage projects towards the beginning of the week to allow more time to complete. For any project that needs to be fired, the day it should be fired will be noted after the project on the schedule. If you follow our guidelines, you'll be able to send the entire set of projects (fired and non-fired!) home with the campers at the conclusion of the camp week. Sweet simplicity!
- 5. We've included a little bit of everything in our projects. We believe the best summer camp projects are economical (About \$4.00 per project per child), creative (techniques and designs), and offer the child several different mediums to work with. We understand there are many different ways to approach your studio camps, but we feel that providing a mixture of fired and non-fired options allows for the most fun and flexibility. Who doesn't love that?!

As you begin your summer camp planning process, we hope that this guide serves as a useful resource. As our mission states, "The Bisque Imports vision is to be an energetic and sustainable resource for ceramic studios worldwide." We exist to help you! Our 15 Tried and True Summer Camp Tips

Camps can be a wonderful opportunity to attract new business to your studio. Done well, they can be the beginning of a positive relationship with a repeat customer. But without proper planning, camps can quickly become a less than positive experience for everyone involved. Don't let this be you! We've compiled our fifteen tried and true tips for a Rockin' Camp. Let's get started!

- **1.** It's never too early to start planning. Many find the slow winter months to be the best time to knock out summer planning. Take advantage of new year's sales and stock up on items you know you'll need once summer arrives.
- **2**. **Keep a notebook nearby during camps.** Write down notes to yourself about what works and what doesn't. If you're not teaching the camp yourself, spend a little time getting the necessary feedback from your counselors. Once the dust settles on a busy summer, you'll be able to revisit these notes and improve your program for next year.
- **3. Samples sell!** Most parents will want to know exactly what their child will be working on during their camp session. Have the samples ready before you start your marketing, and you'll be amazed how much quicker you fill up.
- **4. Don't be afraid to ask for suggestions!** During our own event planning, we like to ask former attendees and trusted advisors for ideas on how to improve. Get camp parents involved in improving your program, and they're more likely to feel invested in future years! Don't overlook your staff, either. Often times, they'll be closer in age to your campers than you are. They'll likely have valuable insight on popular trends and interests.
- **5. Set your budget and stick to it.** Price everything required to keep summer camps running smoothly--from staffing to snacks--and factor it into your budget. If you only factor the cost of the projects into the price of camp, you may be overlooking some of your larger expenses.

- **6.** Nothing can replace a well crafted schedule. Plan your week around a few larger, multi day projects. Then fill in with projects that support the theme of the week (and stick to your budget!) I
- **7. Never underestimate the power of a few time fillers.** While we suggest switching up the schedule every week to keep things fresh for returning campers, these time fillers are so simple that you can reuse them week to week. Have 4-6 in your back pocket for times when you're running ahead of schedule. Also have a few activities available for the super fast artist. (Every week has one!) This will allow the other campers to stay on task without being distracted by those that finished early. If all else fails, keep a tub of markers, kid scissors, and construction paper around for some good old-fashioned paper crafts.
- **8.** Create open lines of communication with your parents. Whether this is through an email list or a phone call, make sure you have ways to gather information on their child and vice versa. You'll need to be able to communicate important details in the days leading up to the camp, and inform them of any changes.
- **9. Consider letting a staff member teach.** Many children respond better to counselors that are closer to their age. Not only that, but you'll find that some parents prefer this, too. We suggest picking several of your top staff members for the job. It's best to have a lead as well as an assistant that will work the store. Make sure that your staff is aware and comfortable with all of the responsibilities. In a given hour, they may be expected to teach a group, clean a spill, arrange snacks, correspond with parents, or assist in another area of the store. Make sure they're up for the job! It may be helpful to work the first day with them to properly demonstrate your expectations.
- **10.** Make sure your staff is trained in every step of your summer camp process--whether you're teaching it or not. You never know when you'll need to rely on them! This includes the registration process--a nervous employee will not be able to sell a camp registration for you. Consider adding an incentive for the employee with the most sign ups.

Our 15 Tried and True Summer Camp Tips

- **11.** Encourage repeat customers by varying your schedule. This is key--customers won't sign up for multiple weeks if the program is the same. While this requires more preparation, the payoff can be huge. Some overlap is acceptable, but avoid repetition if you hope to book repeat campers.
- **12.** Try to have all the projects completed by the end of the week. You won't believe how much simpler this will make your life--as soon as the campers walk out your door, all you have to do is clean up the table and get ready for the next group! Not only does it simplify the guessing game that can happen once you're left with 25 identical clay coil pots, but your parents will really appreciate this during a hectic summer. Try grouping fired projects in the early days of camp, and focus on acrylics, mosaics, and craft projects at the end of the week. This tip will take a little extra thought, but it will make all the difference in the world.
- **13.** Schedule your camps around your business, not the other way around. Your camps are meant to act as a bolster for your business, not a speed bump! Ask yourself the question, "Is this going to be a problem on a busy summer day?" If the answer is yes, go back to your process and see how to improve. This may mean shifting the scheduled times, or creating an area where campers can be out of the flow of normal traffic. Believe it or not, one of the best sales tools for your camps is seeing a smoothly run camp in action! If customers in the store see an organized camp full of kids having fun, they'll want to sign their child up, too!
- 14. Promote as much as possible. Starting in February, staple a flyer to every receipt that leaves your building. (Yes, this requires you to have your ducks in a row by February!) If you're spending the months planning instead of promoting, you'll have a wonderful camp with no campers. Uitilize social media, emails, and local outlets to promote your programs however possible. Another tip is to offer a sibling or friend discount for signing up two or more campers at once. You may even try offering referral cards to parents. If their referral signs up, both parties receive a discount.

15. Have fun! A fun and lively camp program will ensure your success. There's no better advertisement for your business than happy campers. The wonderful thing is that the parents of those happy campers will tell others. With time, your rockin' program will grow through word of mouth!

Few things in your studio will prove to be as challenging and rewarding as camp programs. Take the necessary steps to start planning your best summer EVER! When the first campers arrive, you'll be glad you did.



You'll notice we've included thank you notes in each schedule. This is a great way for the children (and your studio!) to thank the parents for enrolling their child. Have a variety of crayons, paper, and decorating supplies on hand for neat cards. Here's how to create a "pop up" card.

- 1. Fold 8.5" x 11" sheet of paper in half, "hamburger style."
- 2. Make two 2" cuts 2" in from the sides on the folded edge. Don't cut all the way through.
- 3. Open the sheet and invert the fold, pushing the cut area forward. The campers can then decorate the the "pop up" area with other cute designs or lettering. Tip: attach another piece of paper to the outside to hide the cut out area.



MAGICAL SNACK IDEA:

Magic Wand Fruit Kabobs: Make this fun and healthy snack for campers on Wednesday! Combine a combination of strawberries and grapes (check for allergies!) onto a wooden skewer. For a neat finishing touch, use a cookie cutter to cut star shapes out of watermelon.

Crystal Ball Glass Bracelet

Let campers transform scrap glass into magical crystal ball bracelets (or add these baubles to key chains, wind chimes, and more!)

MATERIALS

956 8" Square Tile
CFKITF Frit Kit - Fine
D15481 Aleene's Glass & Bead Glue
GBITS100 Clear Transparent Bits
SP-860 Gunmetal Linked Bracelet
ST356 Wheel Mosaic Cutter
ST540 Thinfire Shelf Paper

SUPPLIES

Angled Straw
Nipping Basket
Non-Aerosol Hairspray
Q-Tip
Silver Sharpie
Small Mixing Cups

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Place a sheet of Thinfire shelf paper onto the 8" Square Tile to create a portable assembly surface.
- 2. Use an angled straw to scoop and mix a small amount of assorted fine frit into a small cup, then mix.
- 3. Pour a dime-sized amount of the frit mixture onto the thinfire paper. Use a Q-tip to mold the frit into an ant hill shaped pile.



- 4. Use a Wheel Mosaic Cutter to nip Clear bits into quarters. Place one quarter piece onto the frit pile.
- 5. Repeat this process, using an assortment of different frit mixtures, until at least twelve different piles have been made and capped.
- 6. Spritz frit piles with non-aerosol hairspray to secure in place.
- 7. Write the camper's name with a Silver Sharpie on the Thinfire. Fire to a Full Fuse using the firing schedule provided:

8. Once fired, use pinpoints of Aleene's Glass & Bead Glue to attach one frit crystal ball to each round disk on the bracelet.

Mirror, Mirror on the Wall

Adding mosaic elements to bisque is a great and affordable way to try mosaics out in your store.

BIM471 Shamrock Glitter Mosaic Tiles 20 mm
BIM473 Aubergine Glitter Mosaic Tiles 20 mm
BIM70212-0003 White Grout
BIM70214-0006 Weldbond
0S447 Magenta
RAQUA144 Aqualon Assortment
SG880 Crystal Sparkler

SUPPLIES

Latex Gloves
Paper Towels
Plastic Spoon (to mix grout)
Small Disposable Bowl (for grout mix)

ST356 Wheel Mosaic Nipper

INSTRUCTIONS

- 1. Using Weldbond as adhesive, adhere one Leafy Pebble to the base of the handle.
- 2. Along the mirror handle, adhere Shamrock Glitter tiles. If needed, use the Wheel Mosaic Nipper to nip pieces to desired size.



- 3. Adhere Midnight Water Iridescent tiles around the border of the flower shape.
- 4. Fill in the remaining areas of the flower with small nipped pieces of Aubergine Glitter tiles.
- 5. Then, follow the grouting instructions found on page 37 to finish using White Grout.
- 6. Allow grout to dry to the touch. Then, use a paintbrush to paint the edges and back of the mirror with Magenta. Let dry.
- 7. Use a paintbrush to apply 1 coat of Crystal Sparkler over project surface and edges. Let dry.
- 8. Attach mirror insert to project with E-6000 Adhesive.

Money saving tip - nip large mosaic pieces into smaller bits for campers to get even more out of each bag of tiles!

Fairy Land

MATERIALS

1123 Trixie or 4365 Little Trixie Mighty Tot

1574 Whimsy Mushroom

CN111-8 Light Delft

CN221-8 Light Blush

CN232-8 Bright Briarwood

CN244-8 Really White

CN272-8 Bright Jade

CN282-8 Bright Brown

CN292-8 Bright Purple

CN341-8 Light Pink

CN373-8 Dark Honeysuckle

CN501-8 Neon Yellow

CN507-8 Neon Red

FD258 Pure White

RAQUA144 Aqualon Assortment

SUPPLIES

Black Washable Marker Sponge Water

INSTRUCTIONS

Lightly wipe each piece with a damp sponge to prepare for painting.



Whimsy Mushroom:

- 1. Use a black washable marker to sketch a door and two windows onto the mushroom base.
- 2. Use 3 coats of Bright Brown to paint the base of the mushroom. Leave door and each window unpainted.
- 3. Using the tapered end of a paintbrush handle, scratch out wood grain lines throughout the Bright Brown painted base area.
- 4. Paint the door with 3 coats of Light Delft.
- 5. Paint each window with 3 coats of Neon Yellow. Let dry.
- 6. Paint the underside of the mushroom cap with 3 coats of Bright Purple. Accent with Bright Briarwood brushstrokes.





- 7. Paint the top surface of mushroom cap with 3 coats of Neon Red. Let dry.
- 8. Using a detail brush and Bright Briarwood, paint the door frame, hinges, and door knob. Paint each window frame, as well as stripes on the door with the same color.
- 9. Let dry. Tip: Mixing Pure White and Really White allows you to paint white on top of darker colors with ease.

Trixie:

- 1. Paint the face, arms, and legs with 3 coats of Light Blush.
- 2. Paint the fairy's hair with Neon Yellow.
- 3. Paint the fairy's dress with Bright Jade.
- 4. Use a sponge to sponge each wing with Light Pink.

Fairy Land Continued

- 5. Paint the backside and outer lining of each wing with Dark Honeysuckle.
- 6. With a detail brush, add Light Delft dots to each wing. Add additional dots to the fairy's eyes, hemline, and neckline. Let dry.

Once completed, dip each piece in Pure Brilliance and fire to Cone o6.

Enchanted Fairy Garden

Our Magical Fairy Garden combines the project from Fairy Land with other fun components to create the full experience! Create some or all of these pieces for an adorable final result.

MATERIALS

956 8" Square Tile

1123 Trixie or 4365 Little Trixie Mighty Tot (painted)

1574 Whimsy Mushroom (already painted)

8301 E-6000 Adhesive

BIM102 Grav-dient Pebble Assortment

D31210 Aleene's Matte Decoupage

OS432 Ivory

OS450 Lilac

0S471 Medium Brown

0S473 Black Brown

RAQUA144 Aqualon Assortment

SUPPLIES

Craft Moss

Elmer's Clear Gel Glue

Hemp Cord

Latex Gloves

Scissors

Sponge

Tape

Wooden Craft Sticks



- 1. Paint the entire tile with Black Brown.
- 2. Use a sponge to densely sponge tile surface with Medium Brown. Let dry.
- 3. Use E-6000 adhesive to adhere the Whimsy Mushroom fairy house to one corner of tile.
- 4. Arrange an assortment of Gray-dient pebbles to create a stone path. Adhere in place with E-6000.
- 5. Cut two strands of hemp cord and adhere along each side of stone path.
- 6. Use scissors to cut wooden craft sticks in half. Paint the front and backside of each craft stick with Ivory. Let dry.
- 7. Arrange half-cut wooden craft sticks vertically side-by-side to create a picket fence.





Enchanted Fairy Garden Continued

- 13. Use a paintbrush to generously dab Aleene's Matte Decoupage over the moss-covered areas. If needed, trim the moss along the tile edges with scissors.
- 14. Use E-6000 to adhere the Trixie to the tile surface.
- 15. Adhere the completed fairy garden sign upright to tile surface. For greater stability as it dries, position the sign leaning against another object. Let project dry completely.
- 8. Cut four additional strands of hemp cord. Adhere two strands horizontally across one side of the picket fence. Once dry, flip fence over and repeat on opposite side. Position hemp cords in place with tape until dry.
- 9. Use E-6000 to adhere the wooden picket fence upright along the back edge of tile. Use tape to secure fence as it dries.
- 10. Adhere three half-cut craft sticks to create a small sign. Paint the front and backside of vertical sign base with Ivory. Paint the horizontal sign with Lilac. Let dry.
- 11. Once dry, use a detail brush and Black Brown to paint "Fairy Garden" on the sign. Set aside to dry.
- 12. Adhere bunches of craft moss to the remaining ground area of tile. To adhere, coat surface with Elmer's Clear Gel Glue then press moss firmly onto tile. As you work, wear latex gloves to keep your hands clean!

The quickest way to make parents and campers happy? Handprint art! Transform those precious prints into castles, dinosaurs and more with this fantastical design!

MATERIALS

AA7010 Canvas Panel 12" x 12"

AS959 Duncan Hi-Gloss Sealer

OS431 White

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Lightly sketch a landscape background design onto the canvas with a pencil.



- 2. Paint the landscape and background with your choice of acrylic paint colors.
- 3. For this project, we used Medium Green, Bright Green, and Lemon Grass to paint a rolling hills landscape. Blend the colors to create varied shades of green for each hill.
- 4. Paint the sky with Medium Blue.
- 5. Sponge White across the sky in scattered places to create the look of clouds. Let dry.
- 6. Apply the first handprint along the uppermost hill, towards the upper right corner, in Cotton Candy.
- 7. Apply the second handprint along the lower hill, near the bottom left corner, in Bright Red.
- 8. Use Bright Red to paint the head, feet, and tail of the dragon on the Bright Red handprint.





- 9. Use Concord to paint spikes along the dragon's head and backside, and scales along the neck. Use the same color to paint the underbelly, stripes along the nose, and stripes in between each finger print.
- 10. Use White to paint the dragon's eye. With Black, add a smaller dot on the eye.
- 11. Use a detail brush to accent and outline the dragon with Black. Add fire from the dragon's mouth with streaks of Dark Yellow and Bright Red.
- 12. To paint the handprint castle, use Miami Pink to paint a triangle at the tip of each finger print. Use the same color to paint the wall above the palm of the hand, and the border around the door.
- 13. Paint the door with Light Brown. Outline and accent the door using a detail brush and Black.
- 14. At the tip of each triangle tower, use Dark Yellow to paint a flag pole. Use the same color to

paint a curving path that begins at the castle door and runs across two hill arches. Outline path with Black.

- 15. Paint each window with White.
- 16. Paint each tower flag with Concord. Use the same color to paint the base of the door and ruffles below the center tower.
- 17. Paint each window ledge with Concord. Use the same color, again, to outline each window.
- 18. Once your project is completed and fully dry, cover the canvas surface with a coat of Duncan's Hi-Gloss Sealer.

Looking for other fun hand and foot print ideas? Try creating a unicorn with a footprint, a butterfly from 2 hands, or an animal from a handprint!

Sweet Dreamer

Keep dreams sweet with this adorable mixed media dream catcher!

MATERIALS

947 7" Round Tile

8301 E-6000 Adhesive

BIM364 Royal Richness Round Pebbles 12 mm

OS435 Dark Yellow

0\$441 Dresden Flesh

OS468 Deep Turquoise

OS469 Light Turquoise

OS569 Concord

0S586 Ultra Marine

RAQUA144 Aqualon Assortment

SP-DF Doodle Friends 12" x 12" Paper Pack

SUPPLIES

Assorted Ribbon

Glue Stick

Hemp Cord

Hole Punch

INSTRUCTIONS

1. Lightly wipe ware with a damp sponge to prepare surface for painting.



- 2. Around the border of the tile, paint large stripes using Deep Turquoise, Light Turquoise, Concord, and Ultra Marine. Let dry.
- 3. Add smaller stripes around border with 2 coats of Dark Yellow.
- 4. Paint the center circle, edges, and backside of tile with Dresden Flesh. Let dry.
- 5. Use E-6000 adhesive to glue Royal Richness pebbles in scattered spots around center circle edge, and one pebble in the center of the circle.
- 6. Cut out a strand of thick hemp cord and adhere around center circle. Let dry.
- 7. Cut a long strand of thin string. Adhere one end directly beside center pebble.
- 8. Weave the string around the various pebbles to create the center web of dream catcher. Once complete, adhere the end of the string around

TIP: Drill holes and add string and beads to make it a plaque, or attach command strips to hang from a wall!

center pebble with a pinpoint of E-6000.

- 9. Add additional pebbles in scattered spots throughout woven web. Let dry.
- 10. On scrapbook paper or construction paper, sketch and cut out variously-sized feather shapes. Decorate with acrylics if desired. Create dangling feathers by punching a hole through one tip and adding string to hang.
- 11. Cut out an assortment of ribbon strands in various lengths.
- 12. Flip round tile over, then use tape or a glue stick to secure ribbon and feather designs so that they hang below dream catcher base. Layer the strands of ribbon to create more volume.








Repeat pattern sequence to fill the entire frame.

- 3. Arrange the glass into place on your piece, and secure using a small amount of Glas-Tac.
- 4. Break small pieces of Black Stringers and arrange between each tail feather. To avoid rolling, first dip the end of the Stringer in Glas-Tac glue.

10. Use adhesive to attach fired project to the Brass Night Light Bracket, then attach bracket to the Night Light Base.

- 5. Fill the two bottom sections next to the body with Sunflower frit.
- 6. Use an angled straw to scoop a ring of Medium Blue frit around each yellow eyespot.
- 7. Fill in the remaining area of each tail feather with Amazon Green frit. Use a detail brush to brush off excess frit on the body and on each Stringer.
- 8. Once you've covered the surface with Frit, spritz the entire surface with non-aerosol hairspray. Let dry.
- 9. Place on a piece of Thinfire Shelf Paper and write the child's name on the paper with a Silver Sharpie. Fire to a contour fuse using the firing schedule provided:

Tip: for best results, allow the glue to completely dry before attaching the night light base.



- 4. Using a mix of acrylic paint colors, splatter paint the canvas background. To splatter paint, generously load your paintbrush with paint, stand about 1–2 inches away from canvas, and flick your wrist and arm to achieve each splatter line. Repeat as desired.
- 5. For this project, we splatter painted White, Pansy, Brite Gold, and Silver onto the canvas. Allow paint to dry completely.



- 6. Use a pin to gently remove contact paper shapes. Sketch the rocket ship design and each planet design onto canvas with a pencil. Paint the rocket ship and each planet with your choice of acrylic paints.
- 7. Paint the bottom section of the ship body with Bright Red. Use the same color to paint the tip of the ship nose.
- 8. Use Orange Peel to paint the stripe below the ship's nose, and the top and bottom stripe on the ship body.
- 9. Paint the ship window with Medium Blue.
- 10. Use Deep Turquoise to fill in the rest of the ship body.
- 11. Paint the inner flame with Lemon Peel and the outer flame with Dark Yellow.

 - 13. Alternate using Medium Green and Lemon Grass to paint each wavy section of the left corner planet. Once dry, paint a thin Medium Green wavy streak in each Lemon Grass section.
 - 14. Use Miami Pink to paint each splatter shape on upper right planet. Fill in the rest of the planet with Bright Red.
 - 15. Paint the ring around bottom right planet with Dark Yellow. Alternate using Medium Blue and Bright Blue to paint each wavy section on the planet.
 - 16. Use a detail brush and Black to outline and accent the rocket ship and each planet. Let dry.
 - 17. Once your project is completed and fully dry, cover the canvas surface with a coat of Duncan's Hi-Gloss Sealer.



TIP: Always wear gloves when handling dye to keep hands clean!

- 1. Use a permanent marker to write each camper's name on their shirt tag and gallon-sized Ziplock bag.
- 2. Set up workspace. Cover any counter or table space with large trash bags or a plastic tablecloth. If you have a large sink available, use this space to dye each t-shirt.
- 3. Fill each dye bottle with water up to the line, then thoroughly shake to mix color.



- 4. Use multiple rubber bands to band t-shirt according to the desired technique design. See template for a guide to each technique.
- 5. Apply dye directly to fabric, ensuring the dye is penetrating all layers. Be careful not to oversaturate the shirt, as colors will begin to muddle together.
- 6. Once dyed, place damp t-shirt into the gallonsized Ziplock bag and allow t-shirt to set for at least 6-8 hours. Prolong time to achieve greater color intensity.
- 7. Follow the kit instructions to rinse, wash, and dry the t-shirt.
- 8. Once finished, use scissors to cut down the front of the t-shirt to create your own tie-dye lab coat!



Tips for stress and mess free grouting with campers

- 1. Mix your grout to a thin peanut butter consistency in a large mixing bowl.
- 2. Have the table and work area prepared with trash bags or a disposable table cloth.
- 3. Walk around the table and dispense a small dollop of grout onto each camper's project.
- 4. Instruct the campers to quickly smooth the grout into the areas between tiles. The final result should fill in all the spaces, while the tiles are all still visible under a thin cloudy layer. Don't forget to wipe the sides of the mosaic with a thin layer of grout, too!
 - 5. Allow to dry for a few minutes (the next step is easier if the grout is still a little wet!)
- 6. Give each camper a damp sponge so they can wipe the grout off the top of the tiles. Since the grout isn't dry, don't focus on removing the cloudiness but the grit of the grout at this step.
 - 7. Set projects aside and allow to completely dry.
 Wrap up tablecloth and throw away.
- 8 Optional last step: spritz a paper towel with glass cleaner. Polish each tile to remove any cloudiness.





- 6. Alternate using Turquoise Green and Peacock Green frit to fill in each swirl line area.
- 7. Fill in the remaining background areas with Medium Blue frit.

- 8. With the handle of a detail brush, gently marbleize the colored frit in the direction of each swirl.

- 10. Spritz the project with hairspray, or apply a small amount using a detail writer filled with hairspray. Let dry.

- 3. Paint the opposite side with 3 coats of Light Purple.
- 4. On a 3" x 4" piece of contact paper, use a black sharpie to draw the shape outline of one favorite thing. On another piece of contact paper, draw the shape outline of a second favorite thing. In this project, we drew an ice cream cone and a fox.
- 5. Cut out each favorite thing shape. Remove the protective backing, then firmly adhere each shape to one of two unpainted sides.



- 6. Paint one unpainted side with 3 coats of Light Aqua. Paint the other unpainted side with 3 coats of Light Jade. Once dry, gently remove contact paper shape.
- 7. In each favorite thing shape, use a black washable marker to draw the shape details.
- 8. Using either a Q-tip, a toothpick, or the tip of a detail brush, fill in each shape with small colored dots.
- 9. To paint the ice cream cone, we used Fruit Punch and Bright Honeysuckle to fill in the syrup topping, Bright Briarwood to fill in the ice cream color, Earthen Moss to trace the checkerboard cone lines, and Bright Butternut to fill in the rest of the cone.
- 10. To paint the fox, we used Light Ginger to paint the tail end, chest, and cheeks; Bright Honeysuckle to paint the ears; Neon Orange to paint the body, tail, and head; and Dark Black to paint the nose and eyes.

Perfect Pointillism Cont.

- 11. On one fully painted side, use a thin black Sharpie to sketch out one favorite place. On the other fully painted side, sketch out a second favorite place. For this project, we drew a house and a beach scene.
- 12. To paint the house scene, we used Neon Blue to paint the clouds, Earthen Moss and Bright Briarwood to paint the roof, Bright Honeysuckle and Fruit Punch to paint the house sides, Bright Briarwood to paint the door, Dark Black and Bright Butternut to paint the windows, and Bright Kiwi to paint the grass.
- 13. To paint the beach scene, we used Neon Orange to paint the sun, Really White to paint the umbrella stand, Fruit Punch and Bright Purple to paint the umbrella, Earthen Moss to paint the sand, and Neon Blue and Dark Sapphire to paint the water.
- 14. Paint the inside with 3 coats of Dark Sapphire. Let dry.
- 15. Dip in Pure Brilliance and fire to Cone o6.

Did you know: Artist Georges Seurat was the developer of a very scientific way of painting known as pointillism. He used tiny dots of pure color, side by side to build form in his paintings. These tiny dots of paint, when side by side, give the viewer's eye a chance to blend the color optically, rather than having the colors readily blended on the canvas.

This was also known as divisionism.

- 5. On the painted half of the canvas, fill in the background with Miami Pink. Accent with polka dots in a contrasting color. Let dry.
- 6. Now switch with your partner across the table! From here on, all steps will be completed on the

partner's canvas. On the unpainted half of the canvas, sketch a partner's frontal portrait with a pencil.

- 7. Again, use a variety of colors to fill in your partner's portrait.
- 8. For this project, we used Medium Blue to paint the face; Light Turquoise for the neck; Bright Red and Pansy for the hair; Gold for the ear; Miami Pink for the necklace and mouth; Bright Red for the eyebrow; and Gold, Miami Pink, Pansy, and Light Turquoise for the eye.
- 9. Fill in the remaining half of background with Medium Green. Accent as desired. Let dry.
- 10. Use a detail brush and Black to outline and accent the entire project.
- 11. Once your project is completed and fully dry, cover the canvas surface with a coat of Duncan's Hi-Gloss Sealer.

- 4. Once dry, lightly sketch a tree design onto the canvas with a pencil.
- 5. Paint the trunk of the tree with Walnut. Paint the trunk in fluid motions by drawing the sides swaying as opposed to drawing straight lines. Extend branches from center and paint swirls at each branch tip.
- 6. Along bottom edge of canvas, use Medium Green to paint the ground. Let dry.
- Once your project is completed and fully dry, cover the canvas surface with a coat of Duncan's Hi-50

Tip: Use Art Tape to hold the wire curves and swirls in place as the glue dries. Swirl wire evenly around a pen or a marker for uniform shapes!

Gloss Sealer. Let dry.

- 8. Form long curves and spirals with Gold Artistic Wire, to flow with the direction of the tree trunk and branches. Use E6000 to adhere each wire swirl to canvas surface surface.
- 9. Use E6000 to adhere your choice of buttons along scattered areas of the ground, tree trunk, and along scattered branch swirls. Let dry.






INSTRUCTIONS

Glass Frame Border:

- 1. Place a sheet of thinfire paper onto the 8" Square tile. Use this surface as a portable assembly surface for building your glass project.
- 2. Position the frame in the center of the tile, directly on the thinfire paper. Trace the frame shape with a pencil, then set aside.
- 3. Measure out four 5 1/2" strips, and mark each point with a black Sharpie.
- 4. Place each strip flat onto a cutting surface. Use a Pistol Grip Glass Cutter to score a line at every marked point along each strip. Break along each score with the Running Pliers.
- 5. Score and cut an assortment of bits diagonally in half to create triangles.



- 6. Along each strip, arrange the bits in different patterns. Alternate colors, or try a mixture of colors for a festive look. Secure bits with a small amount of Glas Tac.
- 7. Add pieces of coarse frit to create dots along the patterns, if desired. Secure with Glas Tac.
- 8. Arrange each strip to create a border within the traced frame shape (see diagram). Secure the strips together with Glas Tac and allow to dry.



9. Write the camper's name with a Silver Sharpie on the Thinfire, and transfer project to the kiln. Fire to a Full Fuse using the firing schedule provided:

Acrylic Frame:

- 1. Wipe frame with a damp sponge to prepare surface for painting.
- 2. Use 3/4" Art Tape to mask the border around frame.
- 3. Use 1/8" Art Tape to mask horizontal stripes across frame.
- 4. Alternate using Primary Yellow, Deep Turquoise, and Blue to fill in each unmasked stripe.
- 5. Use an assortment of acrylic paints to create different geometric patterns across each stripe. Refer to the template provided, or create your own custom pattern!
- 6. For this project, we created each pattern using Deep Turquoise, Primary Yellow, Cadmium Orange, Mars Black, Titanium White, and Blue. Let dry.
- 7. Once dry, remove all Art Tape from frame.
- 8. Paint the frame border with Mars Black. Let dry.
- 9. Once the paint has dried, use E-6000 to attach your fired glass border to the frame. Attach backing with E-6000, assemble frame, and enjoy!


- 1. Print a FUN FOOD BINGO template for each child.
- 2. To make the **FUN FOOD BINGO** board, have each child draw or write a food item (from the list below) in a single square on their BINGO board.
- 3. Print out the list of food items (two of each food item) and cut into separate strips. Place strips into a bowl, to be picked at random while playing. Print and cut out the BINGO letters (five of each letter), then place in another bowl.
- 4. Create 'markers' by cutting out small squares from paper. Give each child a handful of markers to play.
